News around the rooms...

Babies





This month we had the opportunity to develop our fine and gross motor skills mixing and exploring the ingredients needed to make pancakes for Shrove Tuesday. We used our senses as we felt the different textures, smelt the citrusy lemons then tasted some pancakes for our pudding at lunchtime.



Our newest members of the Hardmoor family have been been settling in learning about our routines and where to put their things. We have been out in the woods looking for signs of Spring and helping to weed the allotments ready for Spring planting.









We

have been exploring the Chinese New Year of the dragon looking at the different colours, traditionally linked with this, learning the difference between red and gold and exploring different textured messy play resources. For Valentine's Day we explored the difference between big and small, red and pink by printing different sized heart shapes.

Toddlers







The children have been excellent using their imagination in role playing doing some kitchen chores in the home corner, washing up dishes, preparing dinner and giving a baby a bath in the water tray area with bubbles and toy ducks. Exploring in the role play is an important step in helping the children understand the world around them by linking the real experiences they encounter at home to the play opportunities at nursery.

A small group of children had a fun time listening and dancing to their favourite nursery rhymes. Nursery rhymes are the beginnings of phonemic awareness, they help the children to learn to tune into words, experience

things such as rhyme, rhythm and beat. Dancing together helps the children understand spatial awareness as well as the skills of negotiating and compromise as they decide where to dance and how.





In the garden, children took turns walking on the 'tiger feet' demonstrating their determination to achieve a new skill. Coordinating their hands and feet to work in sync takes practice and the children showed their pleasure in their success.

Nursery Class



During the last month the children have been finding out about Chinese New Year. We learnt about the story of the 'Great Race' and the 12 different animals that the years are named after. We found out about the different traditions associated with this and tried



interpreting them through our own activities. We had great fun making and dancing with our dragon, we listened to the music and moved around the circle underneath the dragon trying hard to work together to coordinate our movements. We discovered this was quite tricky when we couldn't see much under the dragon! We looked at Chinese writing and discovered it is very



different to our own. We learnt that brushes rather than pens are used for traditional Chinese writing. We had a go at copying some of the shapes and characters in our own mark making experiences using brushes and paints.



In Team Times the children have been exploring simple concepts linked to engineering bridges, we explored how to make our own bridge with the large and small bricks carefully stacking and balancing them. We have also been developing our phonemic awareness by learning about Pip and Pap at the farm. Together we explored the story making different animal noises when the animals were revealed and



learning some new letter sounds as well as new vocabulary such as the word 'pannage'.


