We are delighted to warmly welcome Sally to our Hardmoor family. Sally has now started working with the other practitioners and children to deliver our unique OWL Curriculum. Sally will work, alongside our dedicated team, to support our children to learn and grow through experiencing our exceptional grounds. The children have already begun exploring the effects that

the cold weather has on the natural world around us. They have enjoyed using their senses to investigate frost and ice puddles, whilst developing seasonal language and vocabulary. We have also been very busy in our allotment, preparing the raised beds for planting.



Parent Working Party (Saturday 17 February 10:00 – 12:00)

We hope to see many parent volunteers on Saturday 17 February to support in our allotment with our annual 'winter tidy'. We are exceptionally fortunate to have such a vast grounds of natural beauty, which offer the children of Hardmoor a unique experience! News around the rooms...

Rabbits



The team would like to thank you all for attending our babies' Christmas party. We all had a fantastic time and were delighted that so many of you were able to join us!

We have spent lots of time exploring 'cold' so far this term. The children were excited to explore a flurry of snow in the allotment, the frozen builder's trays and of course seeing the chickens. We have been busy finding frozen leaves for the children to see and feel.





Inside we have spent lots of time in the soft play room developing our climbing and problem solving skills as we navigate our way over, under and around different obstacles. We have been trying on different winter clothes in the role play area and developing our language skills as our adults talk to us about how they look and feel. Rabbits have also loved using the torches, during the darker wintery afternoons.





Hedgehogs



The children have been exploring lots of activities both indoor and outdoor. They have been using their gross motor skills to paint big 3D shapes at the creative area, whilst developing their mathematical vocabulary. The children were using big movements, painting up and down, even going on tip toe to reach the top of the shape!



Small groups of children have participated in lots of outdoor activities led by Sally. They were listening with interest and following instructions to make seed bombs, with a mix of soil and seeds. We had so much fun and have had lots of requests to do this again.





We managed to enjoy some snow dust on the bench in the garden. The children were using their fingers making squiggly lines and wiping it off the table.

The children love to freely access the resources in the room. They can become totally engrossed in their chosen activity.



Preschool

The Children have settled well into the Pre-School and have enjoyed moving around the 2 rooms playing in all the different areas. We have been changing things within the environment to provoke learning, such as creating a new investigation area where the children have been exploring magnets and using scales to find out what is the heaviest or lightest object.

Our theme has been Winter and we have been considering the impact of this on the environment. We've thought about the cold and ice, how to take care of animals in the cold and how to keep ourselves warm. The children have made their own icy pictures using a variety of materials.

In the tuff tray we had gloop (Cornflour mixed with water) for the children to make marks in.

Attendance is important to us.



If you are taking a holiday, request forms can be collected and completed at the centre office. Please note that if your child is term time and you take holiday outside of the school holidays this may affect their funding and place at Nursery.
